Adventure Games and Orienteering	Snakes, tree branches, bull ants Sunburn Storms, high winds, extreme	4 5 4	 Activity sites are inspected prior to activities and advise students of what a bull ants looks like/what to do if see a snake. Students wear hats and sunscreen for sun protection. Sunscreen is provided by the Centre. Activities are suspended. Bureau of Meteorology warnings and reports checked prior to activities.
	heat/cold Allergic reactions, asthma, diabetes	4	 Medical conditions are indicated to staff prior to activities. Measures are taken to eliminate, avoid or minimise exposure to known allergens.
	Uneven ground surfaces Falling, collision	4 6	 Students are instructed to watch where they are walking/running and warned of uneven surface. Rules are set to minimise risk.
Orienteering	Student becomes lost	4	 Activity sites are inspected before activity commences Maps and routes are planned to have natural boundaries such as fences, roads and water courses. Students are instructed on reading maps and plotting courses before the activity Adults are positioned at strategic points throughout the course.
Fire lighting and cooking	Burns Food Poisoning	4 4	 Students are supervised at the campfire area and instructed in safe working. Water and first aid kit is at hand. Food is refrigerated until required
General Supervision	Separation from group Environmental dangers – snake bite, water (drowning)	4 4	 Adults supervise cooking and ensure food is suitably cooked before eating. Groups are instructed by EEC staff. A student to teacher ratio of 15:1 is to be maintained throughout outdoor experiences. Students do not leave the activity site unless accompanied by an adult.
All visiting schools are to provide all necessary medications and equipment including epi-pens and ventolin (preventers and relievers)
