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Hazard Identification & Associated Risk Type/Cause	Assess Risk use matrix	Elimination or Control Measures
Snakes, tree branches, bull ants	4	Activity sites are inspected prior to activities.
Sunburn	5	• Students wear hats and sunscreen for sun protection. Thalgarrah has extra sunscreen if required.
Storms, high winds, extreme heat/cold	4	Activities are suspended. Bureau of Meteorology warnings and reports checked prior to activities.
Allergic reactions, asthma, diabetes Uneven ground surfaces Falling, tripping	4	Medical conditions are indicated to staff prior to activities.
		Measures are taken to eliminate, avoid or minimise exposure to known allergens.
	4	• Students are instructed to watch where they are running and warned of uneven surface.
	6	Rules are set to minimise risk.
Separation from group	4	Groups are instructed by TEEC staff.
Environmental dangers – snake bite, water (drowning)	4	Students are supervised by a minimum of 2 adults including TEEC staff
		Students do not leave the activity site unless accompanied by an adult.
Injury from unsafe use of tools (for example: use of scraping tool in print making)	4	Resident artist or TEEC teacher explains and demonstrates how to safely use any tool the students are not familiar with/or have not used before (before commencement of art activity)
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All visiting schools are to provide all necessary medications and equipment including epi-pens and ventolin (preventers and relievers)
