Walking in the bush (Match a Leaf/ Living Things in the Forest)	Snakes, tree branches, bull ants Sunburn Storms, high winds, extreme heat/cold Allergic reactions, asthma, diabetes Uneven ground surfaces Falling, tripping	4 5 3 4 4 6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Activity sites are inspected prior to activities. • Students wear hats and sunscreen for sun protection. Thalgarrah has extra sunscreen if required. • Activities are suspended. Bureau of Meteorology warnings and reports checked prior to activities. • Medical conditions are indicated to staff prior to activities. • Measures are taken to eliminate, avoid or minimise exposure to known allergens. • Students are instructed to watch where they are walking and warned of uneven surface. • Rules are set to minimise risk.
Dipnetting (Living things at the River)	Falling into water Hurt by dipnet	5 6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students are instructed in safety to prevent falling in. • Boundaries are indicated. • Students are instructed in safe way to carry and use a dipnet.
Create your own creature	Injury from incorrect use of materials and equipment	6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Correct and safe use of equipment is outlined by TEEC teacher before commencing activity
